In February, I traveled with my class to Zapote, Escuintla for our annual Servant Days trip. We stayed at a church and helped to build a school as well as did a drama program for the children in the neighborhood.

Zapote is a small remote village located at the base of the volcano Fuego, where the people's main income come from working in the coffee or sugar cane fields.
Unfortunately, this type of work only provides employment for part of the year, leaving them with no income the rest of the time.
